FACILITY MANAGER'S REPORT

G'day all Members,

It's that time of year again – our boating season is underway.

As you will all be aware we started summer with a pretty big weather event!

- \bullet Friday 1st Dec inflow was 1,000 ML/d and the lake level was 71.3%
- Saturday 2nd Dec we had 148mm of rain in a 24 hour period. Inflow was 43,000 ML/d and the lake level was 72.6% which was a rise of 400mm overnight.
- Sunday 3rd Dec we had 18mm of rain in a 24 hour period. Inflow was 44,000 ML/d and the lake level was 73.9% which was another rise of 309mm overnight.
- The total lake rise for that weekend was 790mm and it was still rising.
- Monday 4th Dec rain fall was 0.2mm and inflow was 20,000 ML/d. The lake level was at 74.5% which was another rise of 190mm overnight.

This should set us up for a healthy boating season!

Before this "event" we had only had patchy rain over the last couple of months...so I have been very busy on the whipper snipper!!

We have been kept pretty busy with enquiries for membership to our Club and have been successful in attracting two new families.

They are both first time houseboat owners and are bringing boats in from E.B.C.

CHANGES IN ELIGIBILITY TO OBTAIN A PWC ENDORSEMENT FOR PERSONS AGED UNDER 16

Changes in eligibility to obtain a PWC Endorsement for persons aged under 16 are anticipated to come into effect on the 18th of December 2017. This anticipated change is: "Persons aged under 16 years of age are not eligible to obtain a personal watercraft endorsement"

This will mean that:

- anyone under the age of 16 will not be permitted to take the PWC endorsement test
- Existing endorsements will remain valid
- This does not affect supervised operation of a PWC. An unlicensed person can operate a personal watercraft subject to these conditions: The supervising person must be aged over eighteen years and have a general marine licence. The supervisor must be in a position from which they can take immediate control of the personal watercraft.

Please check with Maritime Safety Victoria for further information.

Peter and Ingrid came to Darlingford in April 2002 when Peter took on the role of Caretaker (now known as Facility Manager). Peter soon became known to members as Pete, Zabba, Buddha or Big Fella (amongst others).

Before joining Darlingford Peter had worked in many fields – farming, truck and bus driving, and plumbing, just to name a few. These experiences all contributed to making Peter an ideal Caretaker. He was involved in various community clubs in Wangaratta and this community spirit was continued in our Club over the 10 years he was here.

Peter's time as Facility Manager covered the drought years. He moved the marinas out past Wilson's Inlet twice – this was known as the Long Island; he built two new small barges used to ferry members out to the marina and back easily; the track to the departure point was kept graded and well defined; trees were removed as the water went down; and a careful eye was kept to make sure none caused damage to any boat. Then it rained and the water came up very fast, over a metre a day. Peter was kept very busy with the marinas but he managed to take it all in his stride. He never seemed to panic. He also did a lot of work on the construction of the second set of boat sheds.

Peter had a great relationship with the Water Police which began when they started using our work platform for training programs. He would get them to dive for any missing blocks, and he also helped them with the recovery of the plane which went down in the main arm after hitting the powerlines in 2004.

In 2009 both Peter and Ingrid stayed at the marina while the bushfire burnt its way down Jerusalem Inlet. They were isolated there for several weeks until the fire was put out just 4 km away.

Peter was always available to members for any problems they had with their boats and he usually found a way to fix or solve their problem.

He was a very social person and many good times were had with members; either on their boats, in the big shed or at other social functions. Peter would do extra to help out at functions, getting the big barge ready and loaded, mowing the site at Big River to make it usable again after the drought, or being Santa at Xmas in June.

Peter was a great ambassador for the club welcoming new members or prospective buyers into the complex. They would be shown around, introduced to other members and made to feel most welcome.

Peter and Ingrid became very good friends with quite a number of members, and enjoyed trips away to many places including Fraser Island, the Canning Stock route, down the Dog Fence and many more before leaving Darlingford in March 2012. After leaving they bought a bus and continued to take many more trips with friends from the club.

Peter was diagnosed with cancer in early April. His prospect was initially quite positive, yet he spent nearly all that time from April until his death on the 4th October in hospital. He is sadly missed.

I would like to thank those members who helped look after the club and move marinas whilst Garry and Jenny were away on a well-earned holiday.


Some works that have been undertaken over recent months include:

DO YOU HAVE CONTRACTORS WORKING ON YOUR BOAT?

If so, please ensure the following:

Your contractor or tradesperson is required to advise the Facilities Manager (by phone or text) that they are coming to site. They are also required to 'SIGN IN' and 'SIGN OUT' in the register at the office.

Contractors are responsible for:

- Ensuring they have the necessary insurance and liability cover
- Maintaining the DWBC workplace in a safe and healthy manner for themselves, sub-contractors and other staff
- Supervision of their sub-contractors

- Raising any issue that is, or may become, an OH&S concern to the Facilities Manager, Club Director or Club Nominee
- Ensuring that a Safe Work Method Statement (SWMS) has been completed for tasks identified as high risk

The term Contractor refers to:

- Actual Contractor or Sub-contractor
- Employee of a Contractor or Subcontractor
- Employee of a labour hire company
- Outworker, Apprentice or trainee of a Contractor or Sub-contractor

• Student on work experience of a Contractor or Sub-contractor

As a member of the Club we require your co-operation to ensure a safe workplace and secure environment for the Club's and Members' assets. If you are planning on or have any contactors working on your boat you MUST advise the Facility Manager and it is your responsibility to advise your Contractors of the above requirements and conditions to enter the Marina.



LIFEJACKETS - DID YOU KNOW?

Lifejackets must be worn when you are in an open area of a boat that is underway and the vessel is:

- A powerboat of 4.8m or less
- A personal watercraft
- A human powered craft including kayak, canoe, raft, rowing boat, kite, sailboard or paddleboard
- A recreational tender

On power boats between 4.8 and 12m you must wear a jacket when:


- You are alone on the boat (this includes circumstances in which your passenger is a child or has limited strength or mental capacity)
- In a vessel that has broken down or is disabled

Children under 10 must wear lifejackets at all times when in an open area of a boat underway.

Please note: these rules apply even within the marina waters from ramp to houseboat. Police have booked boaters for not complying so, be warned!

GENERAL HOUSEBOAT INFORMATION FROM GOULBURN-MURRAY WATER

NEW HOUSEBOAT LICENCE LABELS

Recent changes to the houseboat regulations have repealed the requirement for GMW to issue houseboat licence labels. Please be advised that you will no longer receive a label upon receipt of payment for your annual houseboat licence.

HOUSEBOAT COMPULSORY INSPECTION PROGRAM

GMW's houseboat inspection program was introduced to ensure compliance with the Regulations and to ensure that over a period of time, effluent issues that have the potential to threaten water quality and human health are minimised or removed. The program has now been in operation for ten years and has seen the majority of boats on

Lake Eildon inspected. The outcomes of the inspections have ranged from some boats getting the 'all clear' to others being removed and replaced by a new vessel.

HOUSEBOAT RUBBISH

GMW is reviewing the management of waste services across all its 16 water storages. There have been some concerns with the management of the bulk rubbish associated with houseboats at Eildon. The service provided by GMW is for the removal of domestic household, or in this case, domestic houseboat rubbish. It is clearly evident that bins are being used to dispose of "hard" rubbish in the form of renovation materials, carpets, television sets, lounge suites, mattresses etc.

The cost for the service and the number of bin clearances have increased dramatically over the last 2 to 3 years and the problem has evolved without an increase in the number of houseboats on the lake.

GMW asks that operators and owners take responsibility for their waste and ensure that only domestic rubbish is placed in the bins provided. Please ensure that cardboard boxes are crushed to ensure maximum space for rubbish within the bins.

Houseboat owners should consult with their club or marina operator for all hard rubbish removal and containment requirements. GMW will monitor the bins over the current boating season and will make recommendation on changes to the present process should current practices continue.



A MEMBER'S STORY - KRISTA CALLINAN

For three days in mid-November, the Callinan's houseboat, Latise, played host to a group of Myalgic Encephalomyelitis (ME) patients and their own in-house nurse.

Long-time DWBC Bookkeeper, Krista Callinan, was struck down in early 2013 by a mystery, flu-like illness. With ongoing, debilitating fatigue after minimal activity, brain fog, muscle and joint pain and light-headedness/ dizziness, she was told it was just a virus that may take as long as 12 months to run it's course. Fast forward 4½ years and Krista has a diagnosis of Myalgic Encephalomyelitis (ME), with only a 5% chance of ever fully recovering. ME is also controversially known as Chronic Fatigue Syndrome - chronic fatigue being only one of the many symptoms and as such, the name felt by most patients to trivialise the seriousness of the disease.

Krista lost much of her social life, her growing business and the ability to remain actively involved in volunteer groups, Lake Mountain Ski Patrol and Alpine Search and Rescue. She has since turned to advocacy for ME, joining a worldwide movement called 'ME Action', fighting for change to the near non-existent funding for ME research, government support and education for doctors and healthcare providers. Despite affecting 1-2% of the population, ME is still largely either unknown or ignored by decision makers. Krista has connected with


many other ME advocates, forming friendships where an intimate understanding of what each is going through has formed the core of their bond.

In an attempt to brighten the lives of several of her ME friends, Krista decided to host a mid-week DWBC houseboat holiday break on Latise. She enlisted the assistance of 'healthy' friend and nurse, Stephanie Dickson, who has been a guest at many DWBC

social events over the past 10 years. The ladies had a fabulous time, with houseboat life being just the right pace for their energy-challenged bodies. One lady commented that between the location and not needing to worry about cooking, kids or keeping up appearances in front of people who "just don't understand", it had been the best holiday she'd had since ME had stolen her life 12 years earlier. The group plans to visit DWBC again in the near future, in the hope that Eildon's waters can again provide just the right amount of healing.

REPEAL OF GREYWATER TREATMENT SYSTEM REQUIREMENT

If you weren't already aware, the State Government has repealed the requirement for houseboats to be fitted with a greywater treatment system, effective 18 October 2017.

The following communication was published on the DELWP website. Further information with appropriate links is also available on the G-MW website.



Due to the ongoing issues with the systems, it was determined that they would not ultimately achieve the aim of the regulations. As a result,

the Andrews Labor Government has removed the requirement for houseboat owners to install greywater treatment systems on all houseboats.

From 18 October 2017:

- Houseboats are not required to have a greywater treatment system installed by 1 July 2020.
- The pre-sale requirement no longer applies: houseboats don't need to have a greywater treatment system installed before a licence for the houseboat can be transferred to a new owner.

Further recommendations

Until reliability and installation issues can be eliminated it is not appropriate to continue to ask houseboat owners to install these systems at such considerable cost.

We're committed to improving the health of Lake Eildon and will continue to work with houseboat

owners and manufacturers to explore options for increased usage of simpler, cheaper, alternative greywater systems to improve water quality in Lake Eildon in the future.

Support for local greywater treatment system manufacturers and houseboat owners who have installed a greywater treatment system

To assist the manufacturers that have supplied and installed greywater treatment systems on Lake Eildon houseboats, the Department of Environment, Land, Water and Planning (DELWP) is providing support to the affected manufacturers so they can:

- Engage individual consultants to undertake an adaptability and continuity review of their specific business; and
- Access a business mentoring service that will complement the business review.

Until new regulations are made, Goulburn Murray Water, in collaboration with the Department of Environment, Land, Water and Planning will provide a \$100 annual discount on houseboat licence fees for houseboat owners that have a unit installed.

HAVE YOU INSTALLED A GREY WATER TREATMENT SYSTEM?

A **Grey Water Action Group** has been formed to investigate the worthiness of trying to recover funds houseboat owners have spent on installing GWTS under the now defunct requirement.

The aim is to engage the services of a law firm already well versed in the Eildon Grey Water issue so a small "fighting fund" is required.

It is believed there are around 85 boats with GWTS fitted. If just half of these boat owners join the group, the initial cost per boat will be approximately

\$120. For this investment the group will get a clearer understanding of whether proceeding is practical.

The closing date for registering in this group has been extended until February 2018 so if you have fitted a GWTS and have not made contact with the group you should consider doing so.
