FACILITY MANAGER'S REPORT

Hi everyone!

Well, summer has gone and the frosts are starting to appear and as we head into winter there are a few important things to remind you about:

- If you are thinking of doing some painting or fibreglass repairs, be aware that you'll need warmer days, preferably 21/22 degrees. With temperatures lower than that paint and fibreglass will have problems drying.
- Please check all your ropes are tied correctly for the winter layup. If ropes have been lying in the water for a long time maybe you should consider replacing them. The ropes are

your insurance, so if you are not sure about them speak to Jimmy or me.

• If you are leaving your ski boats or runabouts tied behind your boats for the winter you should have operating automatic bilge pumps in your craft to avoid any sinking disasters. This does happen!

Our projects over the next few months include:

- Finishing off the wash barge and fitting a power box and pressure washer for member use.
- Starting the build of a new main work shed up in the top trailer carpark which will be fantastic when finished. This will make room in the big shed with all

the tools and equipment to be relocated to the new shed.

It's a busy time for houseboat maintenance now with the work barge and wash bay in big demand. A lot of boats are also being slipped for routine pontoon inspections/ maintenance, and renovations. If you are planning to slip your boat best you book early to avoid delays.

That's it from me, stay safe and warm over winter and enjoy those sunny winter days when they appear.

So, after nearly 50 years on the boat, I finally had a significant accident - houseboats are dangerous!



50 YEARS OF HOUSEBOATING ON WIZARD

Stuart and Denise Steer have been houseboating for 50 years and still going! Imagine the changes they have experienced with ski boats, houseboats, life on the lake and within our club. While they could fill a book, they were happy to share just a few memories as they reminisced on this 'golden anniversary'.

As a young family we used to camp at Fraser National Park. Each day the food van would come to the camp but always ran out of stock before it got around the whole camp. We thought it might be good to have a floating shop, so we applied to the State Rivers & Water Supply Commission and received a permit.

When we finished building the "shop" we decided to use it as a boat and enjoy it as a family instead. Our first boat was launched in March 1974 but six months later we decided to sell up and build a bigger boat. Our second boat was launched in July 1975 and moored at Jerusalem Creek. The fees back then were \$250 a year for the marina and about \$100 payable to SRWSC. You could also purchase a swing mooring, located between Jerusalem Creek and DWBC.

After a few years at Jerusalem Creek we joined with other members and formed the Jerusalem Creek Boat Club and decided to establish a new marina to keep the fees down. We were offered numerous sites before settling on where DWBC now sits. Initially, sixty boats moved from Jerusalem Creek to the new marina in 1987. Our third boat was completed in time to move to the new complex.

We sold our third boat at Easter 1998 to Peter and Judy Hughes; we didn't want to have to worry about that whilst building a new one. The new improved Wizard was launched in December 2000. The old third edition became 'Miss B'haven' and remained in the club until 2022.

We have built all our boats, with the first two being built from the pontoons up. When we decided to go to a full hull style we had the hull built then did the rest from there. I (Stu) said I was going to learn to weld as I was sick of getting all the shit jobs! Everything that needed painting had to have four coats with sanding in between.

We have seen lots of changes over the years, but still really enjoy the camaraderie and it's a great life for sharing with the family.


