



Overnight Stays from 1 June 2020

It is with such delight that I write to you on behalf of the DWBC Board of Directors to announce that effective from 9:00am Monday 1 June 2020, the restrictions around overnight stays on Lake Eildon will be lifted and we can return to overnight stays on our houseboats.

This is great news for our club and members, and for the community of Eildon that we all love so much. It has been a difficult few months for everyone involved, with 'lockdown' impacting many people in many ways – adding to that the disappointment we all experienced when we found out that we couldn't isolate in our favourite place – it has certainly been a trying time.

Amongst this exciting news, we are obliged to remind you that we must remain vigilant and aware that this journey is not over. There is still a very real risk of a 'second wave' outbreak as we head into the winter months. That means that there are still safety measures and protocols in place that must continue to be adhered to when on site at the club.

The following set of protocols will come into **effect 9:00am Monday 1 June 2020** and will supersede those made effective on 15 May 2020.

1. Social distancing and personal hygiene measures must be implemented at all times.
2. The toilets, ice machine, and all communal facilities in the green shed remain closed.
3. Gas deliveries can be made via the existing process (book either via envelope placed in mailbox at the office, or via email – payment via EFT only). Ric will deliver when you are not on the boat, or if you are, please maintain social distancing as he delivers the bottle with the duck board clear of personal watercrafts / boats.
4. Access to the green shed is restricted to those who have their boat stored inside and we ask that you enter and exit swiftly.
5. Use of the member barge's is to be limited and you are to wipe down any surfaces you touch after use with the supplied sanitiser and disposable cloths.
6. Gatherings on boats must not exceed 20 people, including the family who owns the boat. Any visitors to your boat should be encouraged to social distance and practice good hygiene. If anyone in your family is unwell, you should not visit others or have visitors on your boat.
7. Interactions in person with the Facilities Manager and support staff must be essential and must adhere to social distancing requirements.

We also recommend downloading the COVIDSafe government app to support the efforts of managing this virus. The Victorian Government continue to urge us to use common sense in our activities, and we ask you to do the same.
